This week we ask you to continue for another week to pray for the PCA churches in our presbytery across Eastern NC. The Eastern Carolina Presbytery (ECP) extends from Durham to Wilmington with 24 churches and church plants, 62 ministers (37 in churches, 5 RUF, 9 as professors, missionaries, chaplains, etc., 4 honorably retired, and 9 without call), 10 minister candidates and licentiates, and 4,000+ members. There are 7 churches in the Raleigh area, 2 in Durham, 2 in the Chapel Hill area, and one each in Goldsboro, Garner, Greenville, New Bern, Cameron, Cary, Wilmington, Jacksonville, Oriental, Fuquay Varina, Chocowinity, Fremont, and Wilson in addition to the 7 RUF ministries. The geographically closest churches to us would be in Jacksonville (Harvest PCA with pastor Grant Beachy, wife Sara), in Chocowinity (Wayside PCA with pastor Ola Forbes, wife Gloria), and in Oriental (Pamlico PCA with pastor Adam Christiansen, wife Mary Kathryn).
