To the Village Chapel congregation from the session and chairman of Deacons Regarding worship inside this Sunday, June 14, 2020

!! God has given us beautiful weather each of the Sundays we have worshipped outside! We are grateful for His many and gracious blessings we have received from His hand. But we are also glad to be able once again to worship together inside rather than from our cars or under a small shelter. This coming Lord's Day we move back inside, but taking certain precautions so we will not spread germs that may be harmful (covid 19 should we have it) and giving evidence of our care for one another by exercising some precautions for a while.

Here is what we ask of you for the remaining weeks in June.

- * Spacing: Let's keep some distance (about 6 feet) between us as we mingle and as we sit in the sanctuary. Those who live in the same household de not need to have this distancing. The deacons will help with seating as you enter for worship and we will have some sections blocked off to ensure distancing.
- * Please use the hand sanitizer as you enter from outside. Let's kill any germs before we get too far inside!
- * We love to talk to each other!! But for now please do not stand in walkways talking as that blocks entry and exit for others trying to keep a distance. Greeting one another yes, but let's save our lengthy conversations for outside. We also love to hug and shake hands but let's hold off on that for a while longer.
- * If you have a fever (over 99.9) or are not feeling well please tune into Webex instead of joining us inside.
- * When we receive the offering no one will be touching the plate but the usher (wearing gloves and a mask), thus reducing any concern with multiple hands on items. We will observe the Lord's Supper in a couple of weeks, after we can insure safely distributing the cup and bread.
- * All hymnals and Bibles have been removed from the pews. The bulletin will contain all that is needed (and even the bulletin has not been touched since coming off the printer). Please bring your own Bible.
- * We are <u>not</u> asking you to wear a mask except when you are singing. This precaution is because in singing we project our voices more than when talking, and for the next couple of weeks we would rather be too safe rather than regretful should anyone become ill. We have masks available if you do not have one with you.

Just for your information:

- * The sanctuary has been well cleaned this week in preparation for our return
- * We will be running the air conditioning but also have several windows open to circulate outside air and not just recycling the inside air.
- * While we will not close the nursery we ask parents to not allow children to play with the toys (as these will not be cleaned each week).

We will gladly 'ditch' these precautions as soon as we can! But for now let us be grateful we live in an area not as affected, let us pray for those who have suffered or are suffering from this virus, <u>and let's come together to</u> worship our great God with praise, thanksgiving, and joy!!!!!!
